# DIFFERENCES BETWEEN UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE

## UNIVERSITY

Academic in Nature

Select Courses

Admission based on  
academic performance

Tuition is \$\$\$ per course

Approximately \$6,000.00  
per year for full courseload

Minimum 3 years - degree

## COLLEGE

Practical – Hands on

Structured Program

Admission based on first  
come, first served – waiting  
lists

Tuition is \$\$\$ per program  
– can range from \$3000.00  
to \$10,000.00

Minimum 5 months -  
diploma

# **GENERAL UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS AT U OF M**

**30 credits for high school graduation**

**5 credits at the Grade 12 level (plus PE40F)**

**A minimum average of 70% over 3 Grade 12  
courses**

**One credit of Grade 12 English with a minimum  
grade of 60%**

**Refer to wall charts, website & handbooks for direct  
entry and specific faculty requirements (p. 48)**



# **GENERAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR U OF W**

**30 credits for high school graduation**

**5 credits at the Grade 12 level (plus PE40F)**

**Average of 65% on top 3-40S courses including  
EN & MA plus 1 other 40S different subject  
area**

**Refer to wall charts handbooks for specific  
faculty requirements (Education p. 56)**

**New this year – Indigenous Course - 3 credits**

# SELF-REPORTING GRADES

Self-reporting grades is part of the admission process.

Students will submit their:

**Final Grades** – marks for completed courses

**Expected Grades** – marks you believe you will attain by the end of the year.

**Mid-Term and Final marks** are submitted to universities by our School Division

# SELF-REPORTING GRADES

Students receive admission and scholarship offers in May & June

Based on final marks and April mid-term marks

Offers will be **conditional** pending final marks

Scholarships may be **adjusted**

Offers may be **revoked** if you fail to meet admission requirements.

- University entrance requirements vary
- Check entrance requirements online

# IMPORTANT DEADLINES

To be considered for automatic entrance scholarships (based on marks), you must apply before:

- U of W & U of M March 1<sup>st</sup>
- Check University Handbooks to make sure you have courses off their approved list for scholarship eligibility
- Admission to faculties will be determined on your final January marks and your April mid-term marks.

# UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG SPECIAL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Based on the average of your 5 Grade 12 courses

- 95% or higher \$2,250.00
  - 90 – 94.9% \$1,750.00
  - 86– 89.9% \$1,100.00
  - 80 –85.9% \$500.00
